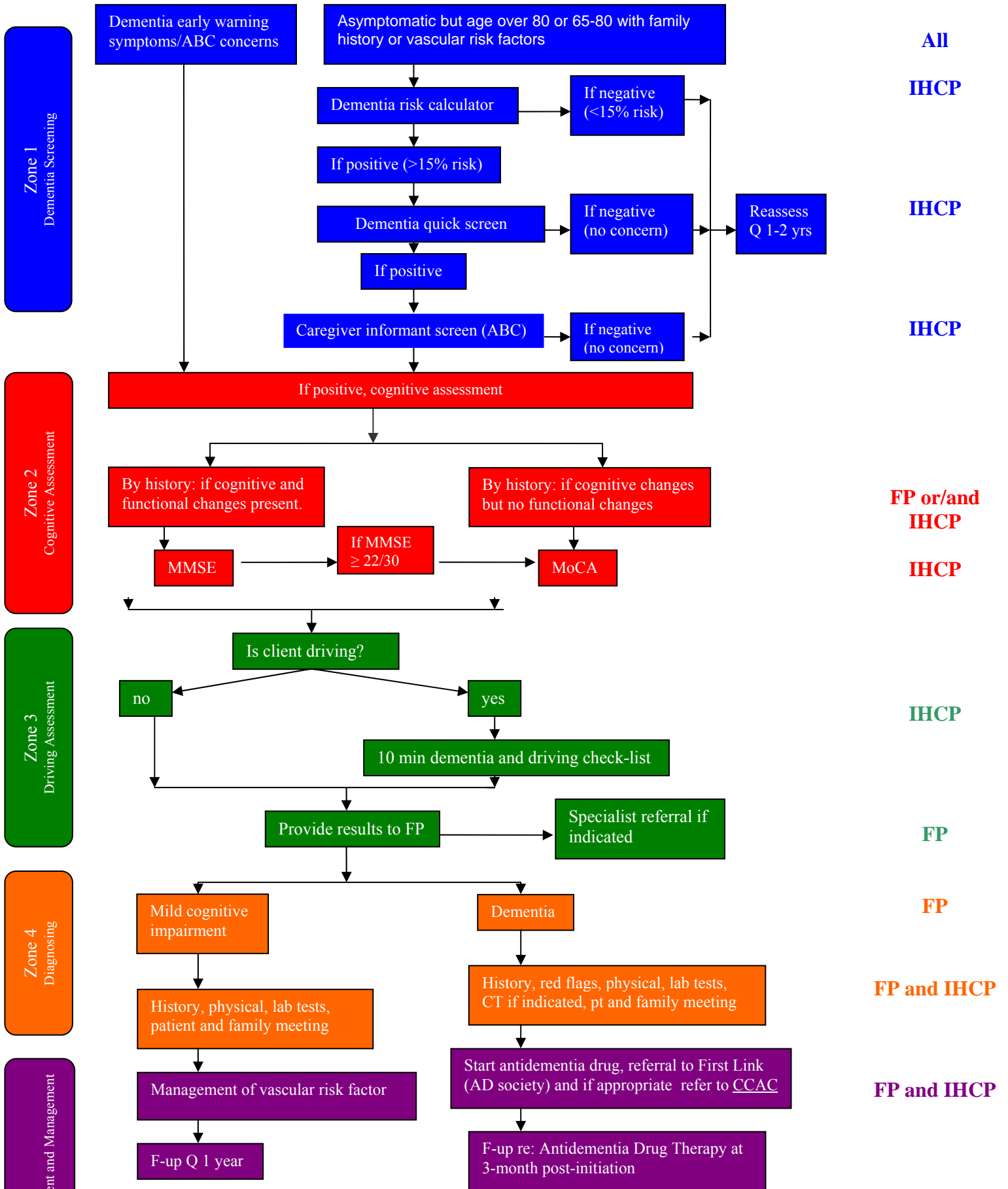

CCAC coordinates applications to Long Term care including short stay respite beds, complex continuing care facilities and Adult Day Programs.
- Community Support Service Agencies – non-profit – www.ocsa.on.ca and www.homeandcommunitysupport.ca. (They have a list of agencies in most cities of Ontario). These agencies help seniors to remain living independently in their own homes or apartments.
- Private Agencies: These companies provide a range of in-home services (nursing, personal support, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, etc.) on a fee-for-basis services.
