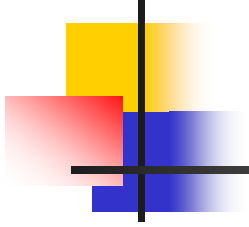


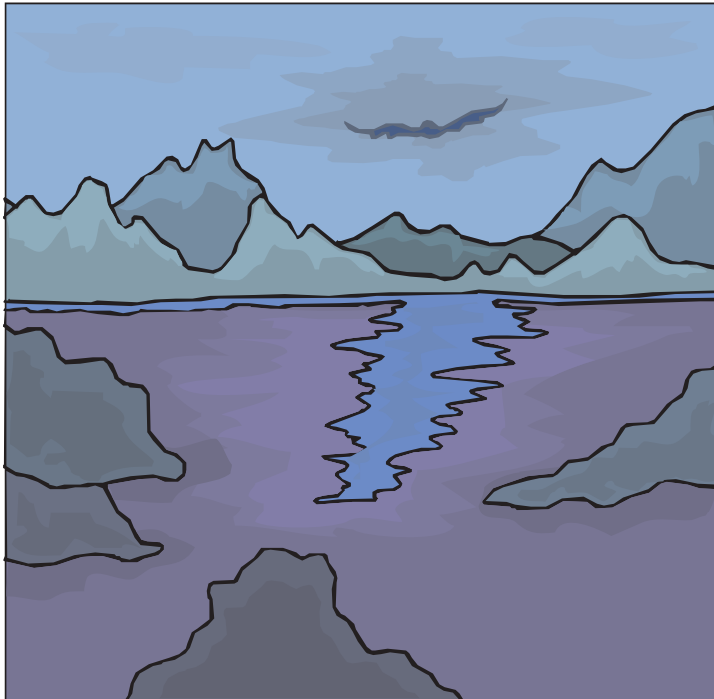

- Overall, her work has positively changed the care and quality of life of seniors

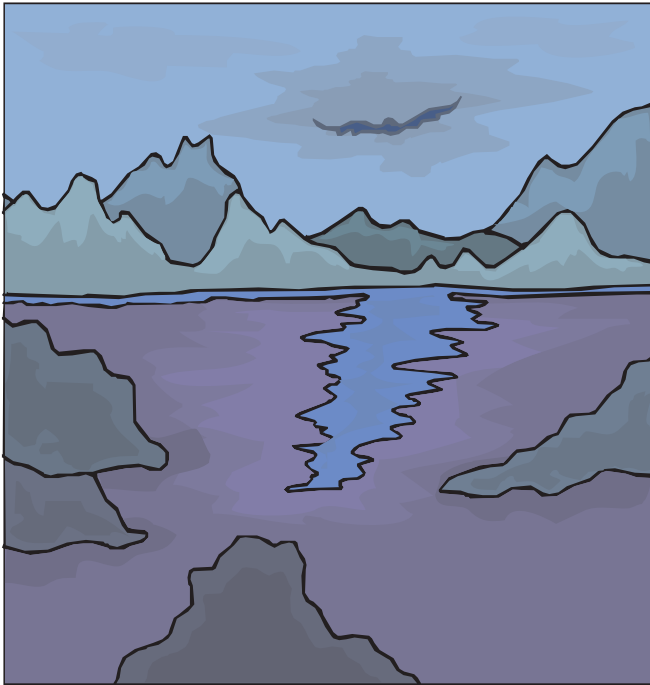

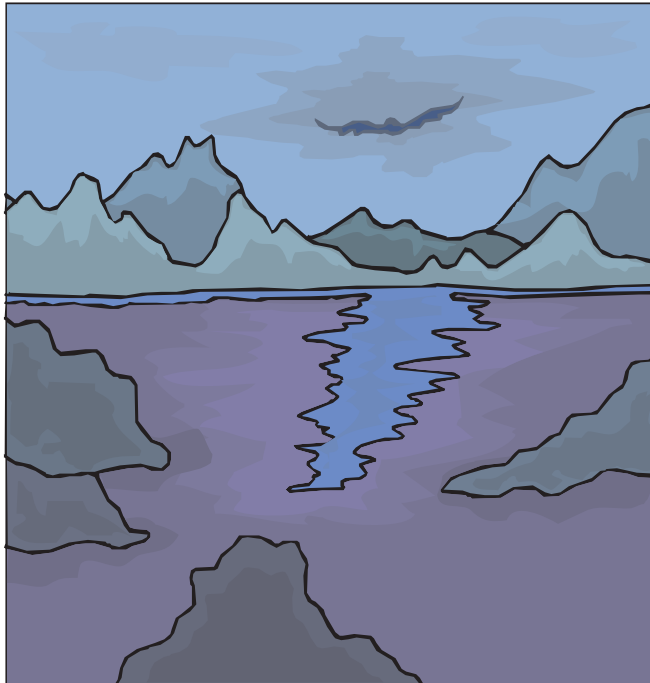
