The Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) and Grand River Community Health Centre (GRCHC) partners with the Department of Medicine, Division of Geriatric Medicine at McMaster University and Regional Geriatric Program Central (RGPC) are inviting applications for a full-time geriatrician to work within the BCHS and GRCHC.

The successful candidate will have a staff appointment at BCHS and GRCHC and a part-time or adjunct appointment within the Division of Geriatric Medicine. The successful candidate is expected to contribute to the clinical, academic, and research mission of BCHS, GRCHC and the Division of Geriatric Medicine. The successful candidate would be hired through the BCHS and McMaster University (Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Medicine) who are seeking a full-time Geriatrician to join their programs. This position is well-supported by a multidisciplinary team to provide specialized geriatric services in both a hospital and a community-based clinic setting.

The successful candidate would be a community based clinician and should be eligible for an academic appointment at the rank of adjunct or part time clinical professor. The prospective appointee with demonstrated capabilities in teaching, administration and/or clinical research will be highly desirable. In addition, the successful candidate(s) will hold a MD degree with Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons Certification or equivalent in Geriatric Medicine and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.

Currently, the Division of Geriatric Medicine faculty at McMaster University based within the Hamilton, Niagara, and Waterloo campuses in Ontario includes a collegial group of over 30 geriatricians who work along with Care of the Elderly affiliated physicians and geriatric clinicians.

All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirement the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify

their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applicants must include one of the following statements:

“Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada” or
“No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada”
